The new garden, which is more secluded from street noises, will be a oasis for quiet meditation and spiritual and physical renewal where locals and visitors can contemplate the great sacrifice of our dear Lord Jesus Christ.

The garden will be located at the back of the Spiritual Renewal Center and to the west of the Grotto.

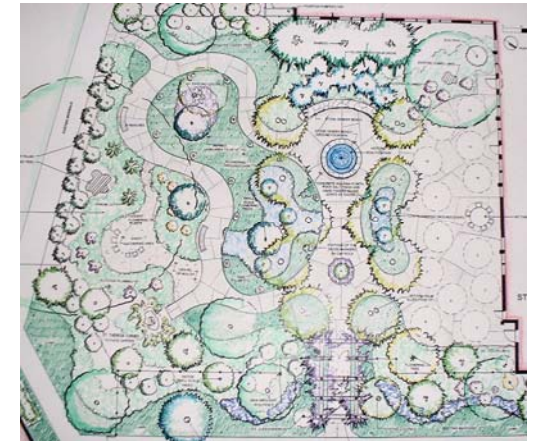
